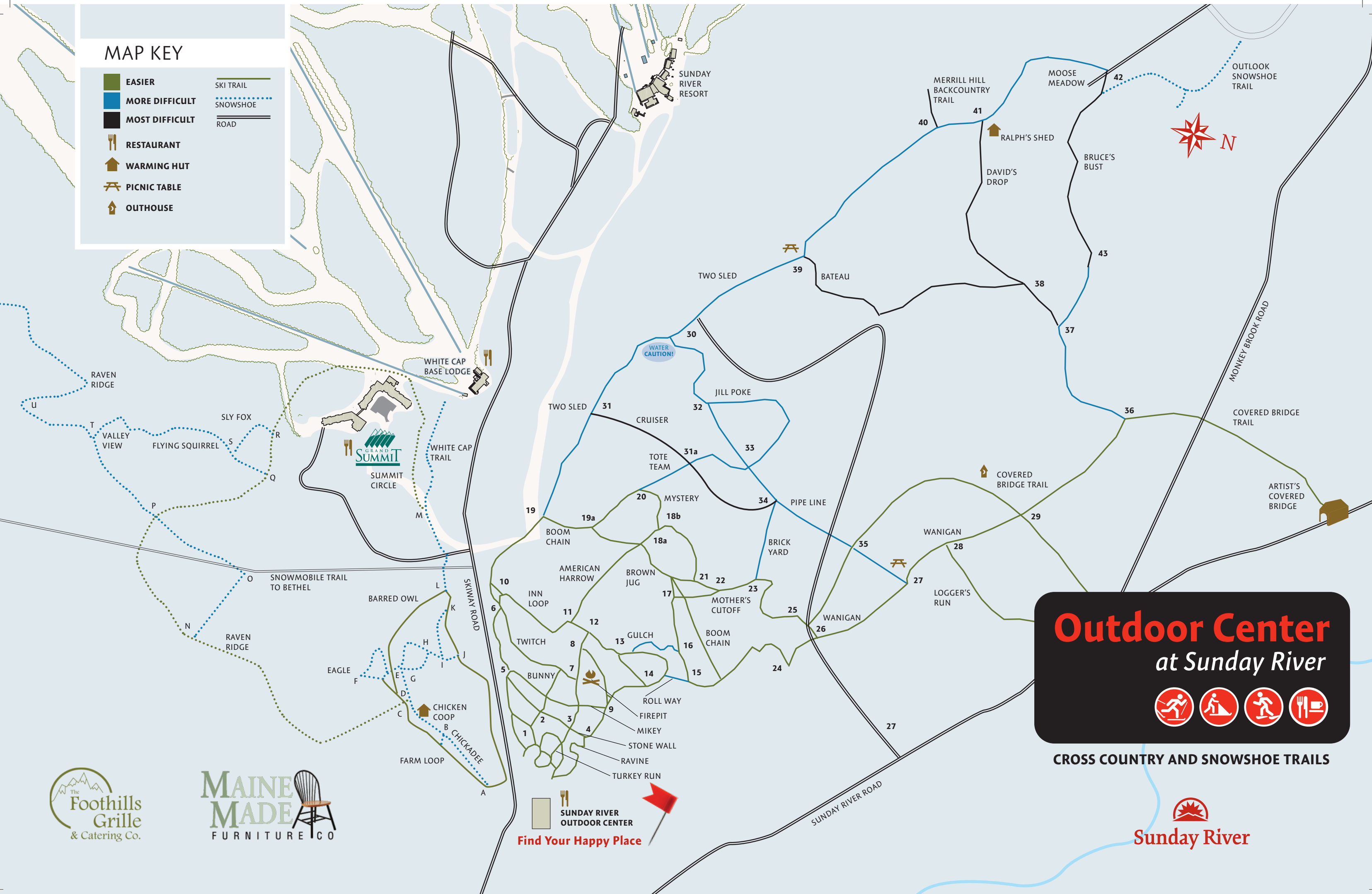

SUGGESTED SKI TRAILS

FOR THE NOVICE SKIER:

Inn Loop: Our easiest trails, close to the Center, including Ravine, Bunny, Stone Wall, Twitch, Mikey and Turkey Run. Beautiful wooded trails on gentle terrain. Stop by the fire pit for a rest and perhaps a treat.

Easiest route to the Covered Bridge: One of the most popular routes to the Artist's Covered Bridge (3.5 km (2.5m)) with mostly gentle terrain and a few smaller hills. Start at either entrance to the Inn Loop to American Harrow. Take Brown Jug and Boom Chain to Mother's Cut Off which rejoins American Harrow. Continue to the Covered Bridge Trail. Return via the Wanigan trail.

Boom Chain: A wide corridor offering gentle cruising down slope from Tote Team to Wanigan or an easy ascent in the opposite direction.

Wanigan: A gentle rolling route to the Covered Bridge through a white pine forest. There is one challenging "S" hill.

Logger's Run: A short loop off of Wanigan.

FOR THE INTERMEDIATE SKIER:

Gulch: A short "S" curve hill running down a ravine that leads to Roll Way and bypasses the steeper Roll Way hill.

Roll Way: A short, steep hill with a 90° corner at the bottom.

Two Sled: A moderate uphill climb rising 200 ft. forming the border of the trail system.

Jill Poke: A series of "S" curves connecting Two Sled and Pipe Line.

Brick Yard: A gradual traverse between Pipeline and Covered Bridge Trail.

Pipeline: A quick downhill run from Two Sled to Brick Yard trail.

Moose Meadow: A rolling traverse through a beautiful forest to the top of the second most challenging trail, Bruce's Bust. There is a Scenic Outlook off a back country spur from this trail.

FOR THE ADVANCED/EXPERT SKIER:

Bateau: A narrow, winding, steep trail that is better going up than down. Watch out for other skiers!

Bruce's Bust: This is a real thriller with a combination of a steep and turning trail with a run out at the bottom that ends at the bottom of David's Drop.

Cruiser: The new Cruiser trail follows the path of an old snowmobile trail connecting Two Sled with Pipe Line and Brick Yard.

David's Drop: The most difficult trail in the system with steep hills and turns. Have a good snowplow before attempting this trail, and watch out for other skiers. You are rewarded at the top with a break at Ralph's Shed and options for a downhill run on Two Sled back to the Center or Moose Meadow to Bruce's Bust for a challenging loop.

Merrill Hill Backcountry Trail: This trail is not maintained and leads to a scenic overlook ending at a cliff. Watch your step!

SAFETY AND TRAIL COURTESY

- Stay under control at all times. You ski/snowshoe at your own risk.
- Most trails are groomed for skating and striding. Trail difficulty ratings are based on good conditions. Weather and equipment can make a difference in these ratings.
- Snowshoes should use designated trails or stay to the side of the ski trails. Do not walk or snowshoe on tracks.
- Downhill skiers have the right-of-way. Heads up!
- Obey all signs.
- No dogs allowed on trails, except in designated areas.
- Have fun, be safe. Please report all issues to Outdoor Center personnel.

SUGGESTED SNOWSHOE TRAILS

FOR THE NOVICE SNOWSHOER

Barred Owl: A gentle walk along Barker Brook through pine and hardwood forests.

Sly Fox: Starting behind The Grand Summit Hotel, this trail winds its way along mostly level terrain.

Summit Circle: After an initial climb from the White Cap Trail, this trail follows moderate terrain to the Grand Summit Hotel and Moonstruck Café. Part of this trail is along the edge of the downhill ski trails. Please stay on the edge of the groomed trail.

Chickadee: A gentle, level trail that follows an old road, passes the Red Farm House, Farm Cottage and overlooks a farm pond.

FOR OUR FOUR-LEGGED FRIENDS:

Farm Loop: (aka Poop Loop) — Our designated dog trail (approx. 1 km) is a novice trail that circles the Farm Village through tall pines, passing Barker Brook, a pond and the Chicken Coop. Please pick up after your dog.

FOR THE INTERMEDIATE SNOWSHOER

Valley View: Following the contour lines, this trail connects Raven Ridge with Flying Squirrel and includes views of the valley below. Valley View intersects with a downhill ski trail. Please stay on the edge of the groomed trail.

Flying Squirrel: This trail drops down from Valley View with periodic level terrain relief. Look for interpretive signs that explain the forest around you.

Raven Ridge: The lower section of Raven Ridge follows variable terrain, which is steep in places. Return via Valley View. Part of Raven Ridge shares the snowmobile trail.

White Cap Trail: This trail provides access to the White Cap Base Lodge, the Grand Summit Hotel and the Moonstruck Café.

FOR THE ADVANCED SNOWSHOER

Raven Ridge: The top section of this trail climbs sharply along a narrow trail ending at a cliff with spectacular views of the valley below.

SNOWSHOEING ON THE CROSS COUNTRY SKI TRAILS

Enjoy all of our trails, but please . . .

- Stay to the side of the trail and do not step on the tracks.
- When stopping, move off the trail.
- Downhill skiers and snowshoers have the right-of-way.
